# Message from the Principal

Dear Poppy Parents,

Hope this newsletter finds you safe and well. This past week has been a difficult one for many of our staff, students, and families with the increasing numbers of cases in BC and the Fraser Valley, along with the number of Exposure letters sent out in just a few short days. While this news is not easy to hear, it is an important reminder for all of us about the impact that this virus can have on our mental health and wellness. We will reiterate that as a school we are doing everything we can within the guidelines of the PHO to maintain student and staff safety at the school. Our teachers have ensured that our learning environment is positive and supportive. Yesterday, I went on the PA to speak to our students and staff, to hopefully alleviate some anxieties, and want to share with you the message that I shared with them:

Hello Poppy,

I just want a few moments of your time. This has been a challenging week for many Poppy families with the number of letters sent home in the last few days. Based on the information we have been given the possible exposures that we have had at our school are not transmissions. From our understanding the infections have happened in the community. As such, more than ever, we need to do what we can for each other - respect physical distance, wear masks when needed, and sanitize our hands. Unfortunately, CoVID infections will happen in our community and may be difficult to prevent. This is not a time for blame -- but a time for support.
