#### What are Semester Transition Days?

As part of the District's Strategic Plan goals, schools are highlighting student transitions with various activities including but not limited to the following:

- Capstone Presentations and Celebrations for Grade 12 students
- Mini-Capstone Presentations for Grade 9 students
- Student Celebrations of Learning
- Additional Student Support Opportunities

#### What does this mean for students?

- Not all students will be attending school on any or all of these days;
- Students who need to be at school on one or all of these days will receive communication from their school or teacher.

These days are structured with the intention to ensure a smooth transition for our students and help foster student learning.

## SCHOOL CLOSURES DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER

The Langley School District uses a notification system called SchoolMessenger to communicate information to families. Please ensure you sign up for our schoolmessenger system. For more information about the system and how to opt-in to receive text messages, visit the District webpage <u>here</u>.

Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather? If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or <a href="www.sd35.bc.ca">www.sd35.bc.ca</a>. Updates are also posted to X (formerly Twitter) @LangleySchools and Facebook at <a href="www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict">www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict</a>. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.

## SEMESTER 2 COURSE CHANGES

Counsellors are processing course changes for Semester 2 through the online form. It will be open from <u>January</u> <u>15-19<sup>th</sup></u>. QR codes to access the form are posted outside the counselling and main offices.





### COURSE SELECTION 2024/25

Course selection for 2024/25 will be taking place during course selection assemblies on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Students will have the option of entering their courses during the assembly using their own devices. Counsellors, administration, and support staff will be available during this time for support. Elective and core subject teachers will present their course options to specific grades on February 13<sup>th</sup>. Students should also review the Course Selection Guide prior to the course selection assembly. See attached course guide.

Please see the attached information for logging into and selecting courses in MyedBC. We are asking that guardians ensure that students are able to log in to their MyEdBC portal, or have reached out to Ms. Heyes for password support. MyEdBC will remain open for course entry until March 8th.
